What's a MOPAR?

When folks now say "Mopar" (usually one car enthusiast to another), they're referring to a car or brand of car - but strictly speaking, there is no Mopar brand of car. The confusion arises because over the decades, Chrysler and all successive Mopar corporate owners did an excellent job keeping the brand alive, and it has served a variety of roles.

When talking with an enthusiast, a Mopar car is one built by one of the original Chrysler Corp. brands, which in order of ascendancy are Plymouth, Dodge, DeSoto, Ram, Chrysler, and Imperial. Out of those original legacy brands, only Dodge, Ram, and Chrysler remain. These legacy brands aren't the only ones considered Mopars: Chrysler bought the AMC, Eagle, and Jeep brands in 1987, and as a result Mopar cognoscenti welcomed Jeep (the only one of the three to survive) as part of the modern Mopar brand family.

During the muscle car era that ran roughly from 1964 to 1972, the big four domestic manufacturers—Ford, GM, Chrysler, and AMC - all built high-powered intermediates that competed on the showroom floor, the street, and the track. The motto was, "Win on Sunday, sell on Monday," and muscle car models available from all four made everybody a player. In the Chrysler camp, these became known as Mopar muscle cars. (In the 1980s, when the print magazine Mopar Muscle came along, any car featured within those pages was also referred to as a Mopar muscle car.) Mopar muscle cars of the Plymouth persuasion include the Barracuda (A-Body), Duster (V-8 only), Road Runner, GTX, Superbird, Belvedere, Fury (B-Body only), and 'Cuda (E-Body) models. Dodge muscle car models are the Dart (V-8 only), Demon (V-8 only), Polara, Coronet, Super Bee, Charger, Daytona, and Challenger. Large-platform C-Body Mopars (which include most Chryslers of the era) and non-V-8 compact A-Body Mopars are generally not considered muscle cars in the strict sense.
