### <u> Mopar Trivia - Southern Colorado Mopars</u>

- Mopar's 1970 model year "High Impact" exterior colors were (option code- Dodge name / Chrysler-Plymouth name) FC7-Plum Crazy Metallic/In Violet Metallic, FJ5-Sublime/Lime Light, FJ6-Green Go/Sassy Grass Green, EK2-Go Mango/Vitamin "C" Orange, FM3-Panther Pink/Moulon Rouge, V2-Hemi Orange, FY1-Top Banana/Lemon Twist. The media gave Plum Crazy a nickname of "Statutory Grape"...creative yes, politically correct no.
- In 1970 Plymouth debuted the 340 six-pack AAR 'Cuda. What does AAR stand for?
   Answer: All American Racers, the name of Dan Gurney's racing enterprise.
   Plymouth collaborated with Gurney/AAR in 1970 to race the AAR 'Cuda in the SCCA Trans Am series.
- Plymouth paid Warner Brothers \$50,000 for the rights to use the cartoon road runner on their car.
- In wind tunnel tests it was determined that the 69 Dodge Daytona's and the 70 Plymouth Superbird's rear spoiler actually worked slightly better if lowered. Why did they keep it so tall? ### Belvedere II.0 (2.0) Part II

Shortly after the hail storm, I began searching for parts. After the insurance company and the body shop assessed the damage, the search for parts began. I needed a windshield, back glass, driver's door, roof, deck lid, hood, scoop, and both front fenders. That's a lot of 50+ year old sheet metal.

The Windshield: This is still available new at a reasonable price.

The Back Glass: That's another story. I was able to find a reproduction from Vintage Auto Glass, and it was not cheap.

I also bought new glass seals, so if anybody needs those, I have a pretty good set of used ones for cheap.

Driver's Door: I was surprised to find out that the Belvedere door, which is the same as '66/'67 Belvedere/Satellite/GTX, but also '66/'67 Charger/Coronet and was able to get this from Brad Buttermore.

Roof: Have you ever heard the saying "Never say never?" Well, I had to re-visit a "never" I had sworn many years ago. I ended up getting this from CTC Auto Ranch in Sanger, again, not cheap, but in good shape.

Deck Lid: I thought I did alright on this as Jerry Reed had one, but after looking at it, the body shop said I could probably buy one for less than it would take to repair that one. After scouring the internet, I thought I had found a winner from Desert Valley Auto Parts in Arizona. It was slightly damaged in shipment, which was repairable but, it was not as good as it looked in the pictures. Fortunately, Jerry Reed was touring the countryside and stopped at a salvage yard in South Dakota and was able to find one there and bring it home! Woo hoo, free shipping! After buying 2 and paying for shipping on one, this wasn't cheap either.

Hood and Scoop: I was able to get replacements from AAR Fiberglass in Florida. This is what was on it already, so that was not too bad.

Front Fenders: At mini-nats, I scored a couple of really good front fenders

I think within about 6 or 8 months, I had amassed enough parts to start the rebuild. Of course, the body shop still hadn't started on it, and it would still be a while. In the meantime, I had gone to the body shop and stripped down all I could. Bumpers, Fenders, Chrome, and Trim. Also removed the headliner to get ready for the roof. I want to really thank Jerry Reed and Brad Buttermore for their invaluable assistance with parts.

So, the fenders and door went to the sandblaster, those got primed pretty quickly and began waiting. The big question was what to do about the roof. The original plan was to skin it and hold it on with auto body adhesive; however, the guy doing the work didn't feel comfortable doing it that way so he skinned it and welded it on, which is okay also. This took a little time to get done as well. The inside of the roof skin needed to be treated, etc. etc.

Then finally the work began in earnest.




Figure 5: and a stripe, August 2018
