







The President's Letter

Hello all good Dallas Mopar Club members, and families. Moparmax here. This is the May 2020 letter from your President. No applause necessary.

How we all became enthralled with the Mopar idea, and cars, speed, romance, baseball, apple pie, and adulthood. I was thinking that I would try to give you thoughts of the past several weeks. Throw out keywords that make you think about days gone by. Good memories. Where we grew up. Where we all grew up. What we all did, and used to do. Girls and having families. In the end, to come out intact, with good attitudes, healthy and ready for the rest of our lives. Mopar lives.

Along with the historical article that Craig Bush submitted to Ron to put into our last newsletter I am rewriting something I first posted probably 20 years ago. And in conjunction with what we are now facing (self quarantining and wearing face masks). I wonder how many of you even remember who won the Daytona 500 this year? I don't remember. I want everyone to say to themselves "been there, done that" while you are reading this article.

The summer of 1966 my father purchased the September issue of Stock Car Racing Magazine while on one of his working road trips. I was very young, but it had a very lasting impression upon me. I already had an interest in cars, and my father got a new Ford or Chevy company car every two or three years, however: Seeing the 43 car, Petty Blue, Plymouth, Richard Petty, I fell in love with the '66'67 Belvedere cars.

Racing, sports, living in Lincoln, Nebraska, going to the super modified open wheel races in Eagle, and attending the Knoxville Nationals many times. My dad had a little special work done on my sisters first car at Speedway Motors in Lincoln, which is a well-known racer place.

In the 1970's we went to the first ever Teleprompter flag to flag live coverage of the Daytona 500 in Omaha in 1970. Pete Hamilton beat David Pearson that day, and Richard had engine trouble on lap 7, and was the first car to retire from the race. Also, in the '60's thru the late '70's we went to the Indy 500 many times. We also went to Jackson, Michigan, Bristol, the Original Texas Motor Speedway, in College Station, and Talladega, all for Cup races. We also went to Loudon, New Hampshire, Sonoma and Fontana, California, and the new Track in Fort Worth. Always, always, always to root for the #43 car.

I got my first Mopar in 1970. Charger, b5 blue, 383, vinyl top at the Chrysler store in Princeton, Illinois. In 1973 we got the '73 Charger, red, 400, black vinyl top, tuff steering wheel, console delete on Ingersoll Ave. Chrysler in Des Moines, Iowa. All courtesy of my father who became a Mopar fan (even though he always bet on David Pearson to win the races).

I purchased my first self paid for car in 1978, my b5 blue Magnum, 400, a/c white vinyl roof, with a lousy engine. That car came with me when I moved to Dallas in 1982, and traded it in on my Toyota MR2 which I then drove for nearly 20 years. I met Marilyn in 1986, and Tem Greene and joined the Cowtown Mopar club. By the way, that is the correct spelling of his name. In 1988 I met Richard Elms at Preston Road Chrysler, and learned about the DMC. In 1989 I purchased my 1965 Satellite, b3 blue, a/c, 318 Poly, a little old lady car from Tyler

Texas, excellent original condition, and in 1990 I purchased my '67 Satellite, b7 blue, 383, 410 dana cars.

I then went until 2017 without another brand-new car, until we got Marilyn a Pacifica. Several months ago, I got the new red car, an '86 Mitsubishi 3000GT pure sports car with only 33k original miles to start taking to shows. Its been to only one so far. This car does have "some" Mopar heritage to it. It is like a Dodge Stealth. It almost got to go to Autorama. These recent times have been the best of social distancing, and have been the worst of social distancing.

I came from Denver, Colorado originally. Lived there off and on for 20 plus years. I have known Steve Elms, and Mark Wilson living there, and here, and back to there.

Mark and Ruthie are back living in Parker, Colorado, and Steve now resides in Glendale, Arizona where he is active in their Mopar club. I remember first attending the CC's Pizza on Skillman@LBJ for our club meetings, several Spring Creeks, and several Sonic locations for events and meetings. Bob and Norma always having a margarita machine at our Christmas parties' years and years ago. I have met and become friends with hundreds of people in the DMC.

Well that is about all for this time. Even though I have never been overly mechanically inclined, I do love Mopars, and I hope that you have enjoyed reading this. I hope that my words have given you a few smiles. Next time we meet I hope that I am asked or told that "hey I used to live in that town, or live through that same experience. That would be a treat for me.


Single membership is still \$25, and Family membership remains at \$40. Current members need not fill out a membership form for renewal unless a change is needed for membership information the Club has on file.

This is a sound straight bodied Muscle Car that has been parked in storage buildings. The vehicle was driven and parked in the fall of 1981, last state inspection sticker was 1985, and had anticipation of restoring it back to its original condition when time permitted. The

engine and transmission were rebuilt before it was parked and has from 10 to 15,000 miles on them, and has not been started in a long time. There were plans to restore the vehicle in the next few years, unfortunately heath conditions will not allow this to take place. From what can be seen, the vinyl top will have to be replaced, while it is off, there is some rust under it. The driver's side fender was replaced years ago, but it looks like it was installed correctly. The body will need to be repainted, and since you will want to pull the motor and freshen it up, paint the engine bay as well. The bucket seats look in good condition, along with the dash, but the carpet will need replacing. We are asking \$18,000 for this solid muscle car.
